Throughout its existence, the National Philoptochos has faithfully supported the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese in raising funds for groundbreaking initiatives and historical projects. Once again as part of its mission, National Philoptochos embraced the opportunity to continue this tradition, when in a letter dated May 9, 2014, His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios, Geron of America, asked for our beneficent "army" to unite in a special campaign of altruistic love and to assist in the extraordinary creation and resurrection of the *Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine at the World Trade Center*.

His Eminence appealed to every Philoptochos Steward in each of our chapters to prayerfully consider an offering equivalent to \$100 per Philoptochos steward toward this campaign, which could be accomplished through a group effort or as individuals.

To this end, under the leadership of then National Philoptochos President Aphrodite Skeadas, and continuing under the leadership of current National Philoptochos President Maria Logus, a Philoptochos fundraising initiative to help rebuild the *Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine at the World Trade Center* was launched throughout the country.

Under the guidance of National Philoptochos Board Members Direct Archdiocesan District President Jennifer Constantin, National Philoptochos First Vice President Arlene Siavelis Kehl and Metropolis of New Jersey President Anastasia Michals, who were named as the Saint Nicholas Fundraising Initiative Chairs, all Philoptochos chapters throughout the country became engaged in the effort and were assisted by their own Metropolis Presidents in reaching a financial goal that was determined by the size of the Philoptochos membership in the Direct Archdiocesan District and each of the eight Metropolises.

The following captures the progression of the initiative:

- Engagement of chapters through a letter, sent by the National Philoptochos President, in September 2014
- Mailing of Special Appeal Materials to be distributed by chapters to all Philoptochos Members throughout the country (St. Nicholas Icon Card, Genesis of a Resurrection Tri-Fold Pamphlet -*Upon this rock I will rebuild my church. Matthew 16:18* showing the elevation drawings and design of Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine)
- A Saint Nicholas Poster was created and emailed to the Direct Archdiocesan District and Metropolis Presidents for distribution to chapters
- Original quarterly fundraising Collection Periods and a procedure for handling the funds were established and the procedure was communicated to chapters
- Fundraising Collection Periods were extended so that the Direct Archdiocesan District and all Metropolises could meet their established fundraising goals
- Articles highlighting events and chapter fundraising activities throughout the country appeared in every edition of the Orthodox Observer and/or Philanthropy Witness

- Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church and National Shrine became a large part of the National Philoptochos website, being updated with materials every month. Visit *our website* for materials you might have missed including the following:
