Human trafficking exists in every country in the world, and in all 50 states of the United States of America.

Actions You Can Take to Make a Difference:

Fair Trade workers are paid a living wage so that their children don't have to work to support their family and can attend school instead. Make your meetings Fair Trade! Visit www.fairtradeusa.org to identify fair trade coffee, tea, chocolate, and other products you can serve that are made without child or slave labor.
