MINUTES Monday, July 1, 2024

The 2024 National Philoptochos Biennial Convention was called to order by Convention Chair, Jeannie Ranglas at 2:05 PST on Monday, July 1, 2024 at the Sheraton San Diego Hotel and Marina in San Diego, California.

- Truly we are an Army of Agape army of inspiring women who impact the world
- Chapters are the mothers, grandmothers, godmothers and sometimes the great grandmothers of our church
- Our scope and influence is greater than any membership number
- Philoptochos is a model of what the core of our faith is
- We are the heart of our spiritual family. Our gifts to the church are like the gifts of the mother, of love and caring and nurturing and nourishment, without expecting anything in return
- Expressed that we are shining examples of mercy and Christianity
- His Eminence stated that he is proud of our efforts in pursuing a systematic review and commended us for re-evaluating the future Vasilopita Fund distribution

Spiritual Reflection/ Welcome- His Grace Bishop Athenagoras of Nazianzos His Grace thanked the ladies and expressed his joy of working with Philoptochos.

- Thanked Archbishop Elpidophoros for the assignment as spiritual advisor of Philoptochos
- Offered a prayer (Psalm 33:18-22) reflection on love
- Expressed that God's divine love is an active force that stands guard over our faith; is a powerful presence that shields us
- Read a quote from theologian Dr. Elisabeth Behr-Sigel which calls us to become co-workers with God
- We are called to be active participants in His army of love

Report of Credentials Committee- Elaine Zetes presented the Credentials report as follows:

Featured Speaker Sarah Sladek-

National President Kehl introduced Sarah Sladek, a social equity expert and global leader in talent. Her book, Member-Shift, Why Members Leave and the Strategies Proven to Bring Them Back, was gifted to all attendees. President Kehl explained that Membership is about embracing our mission. Despite membership fluctuations as of December 31, 2023 our membership has surpassed 25,000. We have approximately 438 chapters. We must embrace future generations; it is all our responsibility.

- Sarah Sladek kicked off her presentation with a video of major events since
 1964; time capsule of how fast things are changing
- We are at the end of membership as we know it
- Economy: has had extreme highs and lows that changes the financial outlook of younger generation and consumer behavior
- Technology: we have adapted to it and it's changing how we do everything; members want access to info
- Demographic shift: one generation in power for a long time; our workforce is now trending younger instead of older

- Changes: living in an era of social media; job changes, response to social inequities; outbreaks of war; people are more polarized - all of these factors are affecting membership; membership organizations are experiencing levels of decline and having difficulty engaging members
- Described features of different generations which affects membership; baby boomers wealthiest and millennials least wealthy
- operational/linear thinking versus for the next-generation of members people-first, mission oriented thinking
- To improve we must identify gaps in our organization noted results of questions posed in 2022; asked are we losing sight of our purpose
- Most organizations are not putting membership as a priority
- We don't have a succession plan unless we engage younger members and to do so we need to be member-centric
- Member-centric organizations are good at forecasting, know their culture, value, have an active vision and are committed to putting members first
- Discussed the importance of collaboration to lead to greater empathy, trust, and a greater sense of belonging which ultimately leads to more engaged members
