



## Elections 2025 – Frequently Asked Questions & Answers

QUESTION		ANSWER
1	Must elections be held in May 2025?	<b>Yes.</b> Article V: Parish Chapter, Section 4, Paragraph 1 states this in the Bylaws.
2	Can someone still run for the Board if they have not attended the required number of meetings, or any meetings at all?	If the required number of meetings has not been met but the person has participated in activities related to philanthropy and outreach, they can still be eligible to run for the Board. Seek guidance from your Metropolis President if necessary.
3	Can chapters use mail-in, absentee, virtual, and in-person votes?	<b>Yes</b> , there is flexibility in how elections can be conducted. The mail-in or absentee votes must be (a) numbered or (b) sent to the election chair in a <b><i>double-sealed envelope</i></b> .  <b>*Double-Sealed Envelope:</b> The double-sealed envelope system is used to preserve the secrecy of a member's ballot.  <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Once a ballot has been completed, it is placed in an envelope. The envelope should have no identifying marks on it. This is the "inner envelope."</li><li>2. The inner envelope is placed in an outer envelope with the voter's name and contact information. This is necessary to confirm that the voter is eligible and has voted. The outer envelope is then sealed and placed in the ballot box.</li></ol>
4	Can votes be dropped off in a box on a Sunday after liturgy before the election date?	<b>Yes</b> , ballots can be dropped off in a secure box that only the election chair/committee can access. Each such ballot must follow the double-sealed envelope procedure above.
5	Can chapters allow one entire day to conduct elections to avoid crowds?	<b>Yes</b> , there are no restrictions to the time needed to complete the election process. Procedures must be in place to ensure that members cast only one vote.
6	Can a chapter use the slate method if it was not used in the past? How does the slate method work?	<b>Yes</b> , the chapter can use the slate method as long as it is understood that if there are nominations from the floor for eligible members, those must also be considered.

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<b>7</b>	Can a chapter have virtual and/or in-person voting?	<b>Yes</b> , that is a viable option, based on your chapter’s technological capabilities, and as long as the chapter is familiar with the online voting process. One recommendation would be to set up a ballot box beforehand, with the votes to be counted via a virtual meeting.
<b>8</b>	Can Boards of small chapters that have difficulty recruiting new members be allowed to serve a third term on a case-by-case basis?	If a chapter has the required number of members to serve on the Board, it should discuss the possibility of “switching” roles. For example, the Vice President could become the President, the Assistant Treasurer could become the Treasurer, etc.
<b>9</b>	Will waivers be allowed for President and Treasurer positions?	Waivers will only be allowed for officer positions in extreme circumstances and for a legitimate reason. The waivers must be submitted in writing to the Metropolis President for her review and consideration. The Metropolis President will forward them with her comments and recommendations to the National Office at <a href="mailto:elections@philoptochos.org">elections@philoptochos.org</a> . All waivers will then be forwarded to the National President. The National President shall provide a written response to such requests. As stated in the Bylaws in Article IV: Metropolis Philoptochos Board of Directors, Section 2, Paragraph 5(c), or Article V: Parish Chapter, Section 5, Paragraph 4(c), “ <i>no more than one waiver shall be granted where an elected officer seeks to serve a consecutive term in excess of the limitations.</i> ”
<b>10</b>	Can elections be delayed?	<b>No</b> , “ <i>the chapter board shall be elected at a general meeting, held for this purpose, in the month of May, in the year prior to the National Philoptochos Biennial Convention,</i> ” as stated in the Bylaws in Article V: Parish Chapter, Section 4, Paragraph 1.  There will be no exceptions to this requirement.
<b>11</b>	How will very small chapters with 5-7 members fill a board?	Very small chapters could allow officers, except the President and Treasurer, to hold more than one position on the board.
<b>12</b>	Some chapters, where the board is serving a second term, are not planning to hold elections. Is that allowed?	<b>No</b> , this cannot be allowed under any circumstances. Article V: Parish Chapter, Section 4, Paragraph 1 states, “ <i>the chapter board shall be elected at a general meeting, held for this purpose, in the month of May, in the year prior to the national Philoptochos Biennial Convention.</i> ” There will be no exceptions to this requirement.

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<b>13</b>	Does the Metropolis President approve waivers before they are forwarded to the National President for approval?	<b>Yes.</b> Waivers will be allowed for officer positions, but only in extreme circumstances and for a legitimate reason. The waivers must be submitted in writing to the Metropolis President for her review and consideration. The Metropolis President will forward them with her comments and recommendations to the National Office at <a href="mailto:elections@philoptochos.org">elections@philoptochos.org</a> . All waivers will then be forwarded to the National President. The National President shall provide a written response to such requests. As stated in the Bylaws in Article IV: Metropolis Philoptochos Board of Directors, Section 2, Paragraph 5(c), or Article V: Parish Chapter, Section 5, Paragraph 4(c), <i>“no more than one waiver shall be granted where an elected officer seeks to serve a consecutive term in excess of the limitations.”</i>
<b>14</b>	Can the Election Chairperson run for the Chapter Board?	<b>No</b> , as stated in the Bylaws Article V: Parish Chapter, Section 4, Paragraph 2(c), <i>“an Election Committee, consisting of a Chairman and two Tellers, none of whom may be prospective nominees for election, shall be appointed by the President prior to the election meeting.</i>
<b>15</b>	Is the Advisor to the Chapter Board a voting position?	<b>Yes</b> , the position is listed as an officer in the Bylaws in Article V: Parish Chapter, Section 5, Paragraph 5(h), <i>“the Advisor to the Chapter Board, who shall be the immediate past president, shall advise the President, Officers, and members of the Chapter.</i>
<b>16</b>	Can you run for your Chapter Board and Parish Council Board?	Although there is no formal stipulation in the bylaws that precludes simultaneous Executive Board positions on the Philoptochos Board and Parish Council, it is not encouraged as it is a conflict of interest.
